The mission of Leadership Irving - Las Colinas is to identify, educate, and develop future leaders and to motivate these leaders for civic, charitable, and community involvement.

Each class is conducted over a period of eight months, from September through April. After the initial team building retreat, the class meets on the first Friday of each month for a full eight-hour day. Program topics include: *Leadership Development, Community Involvement, Public Safety, Education, Business, Arts, Healthcare, Government*, and much more, followed recognition at the Chamber's Annual Awards Celebration.

Participants are then encouraged to remain active in the *Leadership Irving – Las Colinas Alumni Association* to maintain a network of community contacts, identify new areas of interest and develop innovative programs to Participate in community activities.

Who Participates?

Business professionals from a broad spectrum of the community are selected for the program each year.

This is the program for you, if you want to further develop yourself professionally. Participants are typically referred to the program by alumni or because they are recognized as a future leader.

We proudly recognize that members of Leadership Irving - Las Colinas represent a diversified cross-section of our community and region.

Investment

Once participants are selected, tuition must be paid by July 15, 2010. The tuition fee is \$1,000 and includes cost for leadership seminars, meals, program materials and meeting locations. *Tuition is non-refundable after July 30, 2010.*
